## Where?

- Butler County is located in Southwest Ohio, approximately 25 miles north of Cincinnati and 25 miles south of Dayton.
- Considered the center of a "metroplex" that connects Dayton in Montgomery County to Cincinnati in Hamilton County, Butler County utilizes an abundance of both railways and interstate highways.
- The county is conveniently within an hour's drive from two highly ranked international airports.

## What?

- Butler County contains four medium sized cities: Fairfield, Hamilton, Middletown, and Oxford; the smaller cities of Monroe and Trenton; three rapidly growing urbanizing townships; Fairfield, Liberty and West Chester; and fifteen primarily rural townships and villages.
- Over ten state routes serve the county by connecting these cites, townships, and villages, such as SR. 73, SR. 747, SR. 129, and SR. 4.
